







- We can use CAN I and SHALL I to offer to help someone
- Example: Can I help you?
- Shall I open the door for you?





## **IMPERATIVES**

- We use imperatives to tell someone to do or not to do something
- We don't use a subject in imperative sentences.
- We usually use imperatives with close friends or family.
- Example: Open the door / Don't open the door
- Give me that book
- Shut the door







