From Pole to Pole - Manpowered

In May 2008, at the age of 20, Rob Gauntlett and James Hooper became the first people to travel from the North Pole to the South Pole without engines or motors, using only natural power.

hey set off for the North Pole from Qaanaaq in Greenland on April 8th 2007. They began their journey on skis, but their progress was so slow that after a few weeks they changed to dog sleds. It was on this part of the journey that Rob almost lost his life. They were racing over the ice when Rob dropped his glove into the snow. As he was running back to get it, he fell straight through the ice into the freezing water, hitting his head as he fell. He lay face down in the water for three minutes until James was able to pull him out. 'It was four hours before he was rescued and taken to hospital,' explained James. 'Our parents wanted us to give up at that point, but we knew we had to continue.'

After their three-month trek on foot across the Arctic, Rob and James sailed from



Upernavik in Greenland to New York. There they began a 17,000-kilometre bike ride through Central and South America to Punta Arenas in Chile. Some of their best memories are of this part of the trip. 'We cycled 160 kilometres a day, which was tiring, but every night when we stopped, people met us with big smiles and offered us food!'
